NATIONAL VARROA MITE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

In June 2022, varroa mite (*varroa destructor*) was discovered at the Port of Newcastle. At the time, Australia was the only country that did not have varroa and attempts were made to eradicate the mite entirely, because of the damage it causes to bees, industry and ultimately food security. These attempts were to no avail and last year, Australia moved into a management phase, aka 'learn to live with it.'

Once established, varroa mite cannot be eradicated.

In June this year, the National Varroa Mite Management (NVMM) team in NSW put out an EOI for contract trainers to deliver training in every state and territory, and on June 26 - 27 I joined Southern Tasmanian Beekeeper Association colleagues, Ash Newman and Peter Norris to complete a train the trainer program to deliver this valuable training to beekeepers across Tasmania.

There will be 3 training sessions held state-wide - and it will be free for beekeepers to attend. Bookings will need to be made online, but the training will be delivered face-to face. WINTER JOBS

For beekeepers, Winter is the time of year to get amongst the jobs that need doing before we head full flight into Spring. It is also the time to start planning for expanding your apiary - as we know making splits is one way to expand your apiary and this will require extra equipment boxes, lids and bottom boards. Getting those jobs in hand now will pay off later in the season, when you are busy checking colonies and extracting honey.

- Conduct an audit of your existing hives and equipment.
- Decide what equipment can be fixed or needs replacing.
- Get rid of equipment that is broken (believe me it can quickly accumulate). Broken frames make great fire starters.
- Decide what you need for spring, remembering to allow 'extra'. This gives you time to extract honey without the pressure of having to get a box straight back on to the hive.







OTHER JOBS

Winter outside of the hives can feel long, but there are plenty of bee related activities that you can do today to keep you busy:

- Wax rendering
- Candle making
- Beeswax wraps
- Project planning
- Research from beekeeping, to increasing your plant knowledge and what forage is available where you live, now is the perfect time to curl up in front of the fire and learn more.
